



PREPARING THE HOME FOR THE PHOTO SHOOT

Homes need to be shoot-ready when the photographer arrives on-site at the scheduled shoot time. For best results, please follow these guidelines:

1. Clear all debris and clutter from the outside perimeter of the home.
2. Clear kitchen countertops, and visible surface areas. Remove dishes from the sink area.
3. Hide or remove all items that will cause distractions in the photos, including: ladders, trash cans, garden hoses, tall weeds, pet beds, litter boxes, pet dish bowls, magazine & paper stacks, odds and ends, bathroom personal effects and shower bottles. Create more empty space. Hide personal effects - including family photos - in drawers or closets during the shoot.
4. Move all parked cars far away from the front of the home (at least one home away) or move them into the garage.
5. Sweep leaves and debris outside on patios and decks, pull dead flowers, vacuum, open windows, and turn on all lights in the home.
6. Make all the beds. Place the toilet lids down.
7. We kindly ask that the home be unoccupied during the scheduled shoot time.
8. All pets must be contained in a secure area that does not interfere with the photographers and the shoot.
9. Please schedule maintenance persons to arrive before or after our scheduled shoot time. Thank you.
